TO SPEAK AT UM APRIL 27

Dr. Leslie A. Fiedler, Samuel L. Clemens Professor of English at the State University of New York, Buffalo, will deliver a public lecture on the University of Montana campus April 27 at 8 p.m. in the UM Music Recital Hall.

Fiedler's talk, entitled "In Search of Montana," is jointly sponsored by the Associated Students of the University of Montana and the UM Department of Sociology. His lecture is one of two programs being presented by the UM Department of Sociology in honor of Dr. Gordon Browder, a member and former chairman of the department, who is celebrating 25 years of service at the University this year.

Before moving to Buffalo, Fiedler was a member of the UM English faculty for almost 20 years and is well known on the campus and to Montanans generally.

The second lecture in the series will be presented in May and will feature Dr. Benton Johnson, professor of sociology at the University of Oregon. The public is cordially invited to both lectures.
