Four distinguished Montanans will be called to the Order of the Grizzly in ceremonies at the Presidential Arms in Washington, D.C. this Thursday. (Feb. 3)

The prestigious award, initiated last spring by University of Montana Pres. Robert Johns, will be presented to Presidential Advisor Charles A. Horsky, News Analyst Chet Huntley, Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield and International Atlantic Union Advocate Clarence A. Streit.

The awards are bestowed upon persons whose accomplishments reflect credit upon the University of Montana. The Washington presentation will bring to 14 the number of persons to receive the citation.

Accompanying Pres. Johns to the nation's capital for the ceremony will be University administrators Robert T. Pantzer, Financial Vice President, Dr. Darrell J. Inabnit, Executive Vice President and Thomas J. Collins, Director of Statewide Services.

The recipients will be presented with a cast bronze Grizzly bear, traditional mascot of the University and symbol of Montana. These figures, measuring $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches high by 9 inches long were sculpted and cast at the University under the hand and direction of Rudy Autio, distinguished UM ceramic artist and sculptor.

Other persons who have been awarded the order include Robert C. Bates, Lew L. Callaway Jr., William Forbis, Robert O'Brien, Norman J. Holter, Paul E. Hoover, Louis B. Lundborg, Peter H. Odegard, Walter L. Pope and Harold C. Urey.
