75 GREAT FALLS STUDENTS VISIT UNIVERSITY, HOERNER WALDORF

About 75 students from the Great Falls High School social ecology class visited several classes at the University of Montana and toured the Hoerner Waldorf plant west of Missoula on Wednesday (May 23).

Mrs. Deanna W. Sheriff, assistant for alumni relations in the UM Alumni Association Office, said the students visited a laboratory operated by Dr. Clancy Gordon, professor of botany and coordinator of the UM Environmental Studies Program, where Gordon demonstrated floride experiments originating in Glacier Park for the high school students.
