EMMA B. LOMMASSON APPOINTED
NEW UM REGISTRAR

MISSOULA--

University of Montana President Robert T. Pantzer has announced the appointment of Emma B. Lommasson, assistant registrar at UM for 27 years, as registrar to replace Wayne C. Woolston, who is resigning.

The appointment is effective June 30, 1973.

In commenting on the appointment, UM Academic Vice President Richard G. Landini said, "Her long experience and widely-recognized competence in the field of records and student registrations are valuable assets. In addition, she commands the respect and admiration of her academic colleagues throughout the campus.

"We are fortunate to be able to call on her to fill this important administrative position at this time," Landini added.

Mrs. Lommasson, a native of Sand Coulee, received her bachelor's and master's degrees from UM in 1933 and 1939 respectively. Prior to her appointment as assistant registrar in 1946, she had worked and taught in the UM mathematics department for nine years.

She is a member of Phi Kappa Phi, Mortar Board, the American Association of University Women and Alpha Delta Kappa (an international women's education honorary). She has served as advisor to UM Angel Flight, a women's drill team and service organization, since 1958. In 1970 she was presented the Air Force ROTC Certificate of Appreciation for her work with the drill team.

Woolston, who submitted his resignation earlier this month, plans to enter private business on the West Coast.
