WORKSHOP FOR WOMEN
JULY 6 AT UM

MISSOULA--

A one-day workshop for women, entitled "Self-Development through Education," will be held at the University of Montana July 6.

The purpose of the workshop, sponsored by the UM Division of Extension and Continuing Education, is "to explore educational opportunities available to women and to examine problems and questions women may have about returning to school," according to Patricia P. Douglas, Extension and Continuing Education director.

The workshop will begin with registration at 8:30 a.m. in the Montana Rooms on the third floor of the University Center and will conclude with a wine-tasting party and dinner at the Edgewater Restaurant in Missoula.

Speakers and discussion leaders at the workshop include Alene Moris, director of the Individual Development Center in Seattle, Wash.; Jane Ellison, a master's degree candidate in political science at the University of Montana; Scottie Giebink, evaluator-researcher of the Kellogg Extension Educational Project (KEEP) at Montana State University in Bozeman; Marie Gillespie, a Missoula Certified Public Accountant; Maxine Johnson, director of the UM Bureau of Business and Economic Research; Audrey Peterson, assistant professor of home economics at UM and adviser to the Consumer Relations Board of the UM Student Action Center; Joyce Zacek, assistant to the Graduate Dean and a Fellow in the three-year Study-Travel Project offered by KEEP, and Douglas.

The workshop will feature a series of short presentations discussing educational opportunities in the Missoula area geared to specific areas of interest: arts and crafts, community affairs, politics and business.

A film, entitled "The Silenced Majority," also will be presented. The film deals with traditional feminine roles--why women lack self confidence and hesitate to enter the academic or career world.
