MISSOULA--

About 185 high school students from Montana and other states are participating in the Montana High School Fine Arts Camp at the University of Montana.

The annual event, which continues through June 29, includes classes conducted by University faculty and guest artists in such areas as art, dance, drama and music.

Camp art and music programs continue through June 29, and drama and dance programs will continue through July 6.

A limited number of camp participants will be awarded full-fee scholarships for highly concentrated study in music in the Montana High School Artists' Camp from June 30-July 6. The Artists' Camp will focus on solo performances and chamber music participation.

Faculty members from the UM School of Fine Arts and six visiting artists are staffing the fine arts camp.

Visiting artists participating in the camp include John Napierala, Houston, Tex., drama; Marie Paquet and K. Wright Dunkley, New York City, ballet and modern dance, respectively, and Won-Mo Kim, internationally known concert violinist and violin teacher, music. Karin Pugh, a violist who has taught at Oberlin College and Purdue University, and Nancy Critelli, a cellist and UM alumna who teaches at Western Illinois State University, are assisting with the music programs. Critelli is a doctoral candidate at the University of Michigan.

Donald A. Carey, assistant professor of music at UM, is director of the fine arts camp.
