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Central Board Meeting
November 11, 1941

The meeting was called to order by the President, Marcus Bourke, and the minutes were read and approved.

Neil Rasmussen spoke to the board in favor of the North-South Hall annual being recognized as an official A.S.M.S.U. publication. The board rejected this proposal which was presented at the last meeting by Bill Swartz, Publications board chairman, as the annual is not a representative of either the student body or the entire freshman class.

George Luenning, editor of the 1942 annual, pointed out to the board that the estimated expenses of the year book exceed the amount provided for in the A.S.M.S.U. budget. Luenning suggested that the amount of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) be taken from the Publications Reserve Fund which has accumulated during past years. It was also suggested by Mr. Badgley that in case of another shortage, more money be taken out of the reserve. This was agreed upon by the board. Mudd moved that Central Board transfer two hundred dollars (\$200.) from the Publications Reserve Fund to the 1942 Sentinel. Fairbanks seconded and the motion carried.

Maribeth Kitt, Bill Bellingham, and George Luenning were appointed to investigate the activity fees of other Universities having a comparable enrollment and similar program of activities to the University of Montana.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
