AMERICAN SOCIETY OF MAMMALOGISTS
TO MEET AT UNIVERSITY IN 1975

MISSOULA--

At its annual meeting last week in Asilomar, Calif., the American Society of Mammalogists (ASM) accepted the invitation of the University of Montana Department of Zoology to meet on the Missoula campus in 1975.

Dr. Philip L. Wright, professor of zoology at UM, and Dr. Lee H. Metzgar, assistant professor of zoology at UM, will be chairmen of the 1975 meeting. Presentation of 100 technical papers and various field trips will highlight the four-day meeting.

At the recent ASM meeting in California, three UM graduate students in zoology presented technical papers resulting from research studies. They^{students} are Van C. Jamison, Madison, Wis.; Steven C. Egeline, Yreka, Calif., and Donald H. Smith, Stony Creek, Va.

The ASM, which was organized in 1919, meets in various places. The organization, which hasn't yet met in Montana, convened at Yellowstone National Park in 1950.
