CHARTER DAY CONVO IS TO
SEARCH MONTANA'S FUTURE

The 73rd annual Charter Day convocation at the University of Montana will feature a four-alumni panel discussion of the "Future of Montana," at 2:30 p.m., Thursday, February 17, in the U Theater.

The panel is composed of Harry L. Billings, '33, editor of the People's Voice" in Helena; Sam Gilluly, '30, editor of the "Montana Citizen," house organ of the Montana Chamber of Commerce; Fred J. Martin, '25, publisher of the "Park County News" in Livingston; and Miles Romney, '22, editor of the "Western News" in Hamilton.

Dr. Nathan B. Blumberg, dean of the School of Journalism, will preside at the convo and introduce the panel.

The afternoon session is to begin with an organ prelude by Lawrence Perry, acting chairman of the UM music department. The Montana Jubileers, under the direction of Joseph Mussulman, will perform familiar songs from the American Musical theatre. The convo is to close with the alma mater, "Montana, My Montana."
