DUO PIANO RECITAL SET TUESDAY AT UM

MISSOULA--

Lucien Hut and Stephen Adoff, members of the University of Montana music faculty, will present a duo piano recital entitled "An Evening in a Viennese Salon" at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 27, in the UM Music Recital Hall.

Tuesday's program is open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music.

Works to be presented during the recital include "Sonata for Piano-Four Hands, B-flat major, K. 358" by Mozart; "Marche Militaire, Op. 51, No. 1" and "Divertissement a la Hongroise, Op. 54" by Schubert; "Five Spanish Dances, Op. 12" by Moszkowski, and "Three Slavonic Dances, Op. 46 #8, Op. 72 #2, Op. 46 #1" by Dvorak.

Hut, who joined the University faculty in 1967, is a native of Rotterdam, Holland, and he is a graduate and former faculty member of the Rotterdam Royal Conservatory. He has given solo and duo piano recitals in England, throughout Europe and in the U.S. Hut, who has been guest soloist with symphony orchestras here and abroad, previously taught in Colorado, New Mexico and Hawaii. Hut is an associate professor at UM.

Adoff, native of New York City, attended the High School of Music and Art there. He received bachelor and master of music degrees in piano at the Manhattan School of Music. He later was awarded the Harold Bauer Prize in Piano. Adoff has studied piano with Heida Hermanns, Lucy Brown and Edward Kilenyi and is completing work for a doctoral degree in music theory at Florida State University. He has been a soloist and chamber accompanist in numerous concerts throughout the eastern and southeastern regions of the U.S. Adoff is an assistant professor at the University.
