ADEN ARNOLD'S ARTWORKS ON DISPLAY AT UNIVERSITY THROUGH SATURDAY, JAN. 31 sale/rb 1-23-76 local + cs +

MISSOULA--

A display of artworks by the late Aden F. Arnold, who served on the University of Montana art faculty 27 years, is being featured in the Gallery of Visual Arts of Turner Hall at UM through Saturday, Jan. 31. The gallery is open to the public without charge from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. weekdays and 2-4 p.m. Saturdays during the exhibit.

Henry G. Hunt, UM art instructor and gallery director, said the display includes drawings, mural studies and paintings of various sizes. The retrospective display spans Arnold's early drawings when he was a student at the National Academy of Design in New York through his late work while he was still a faculty member at UM.

Arnold joined the UM faculty in 1939. He served continuously on the Missoula campus until his retirement in the spring of 1969, with the exception of two years that he taught at Syracuse University. He was art department chairman at UM from 1946-54. Arnold died July 12, 1973, in Spokane, Wash., following surgery.
