Grass will play the horn during Sunday's program.

The portion of Sunday's program by Grass will be recognized as her senior recital. She will be assisted by Kristine Anderson, piano; Vicki Johnson, Debbie Moore and David Kimball, who play horns, and Danni Nasseth, percussion.

Ted Biderman, a visiting lecturer in music at UM, will direct the 14-member UM Percussion Ensemble in a number of Sunday's works.

Works on Sunday's program include "Cavatina" by Bakaleinikoff; "Nails" by Rago; "Larghetto" by Chabrier; "Roman Holiday" by Christian; "The Good, The Bad and The Ugly" by Morricone, arrangement by T. Biderman; "Concerto No. 1 in D Major" by Mozart; "Claire de Lune" by Debussy, arrangement by T. Biderman; "Fripperies" by Shaw, and "Warsaw 1939" by Butts.

Grass, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene A. Grass, 27 Clark Ave., Billings, is a May 1972 graduate of Billings Central High School.
