UM GROUPS PLAY "NEW"
MUSIC BY OLD MASTERS

Nearly 90 musicians will perform in a concert by the University of Montana Wind Ensemble and the UM Choir Sunday at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall, according to Dean Charles W. Bolen of the School of Fine Arts.

The concert will feature the first known American performance of five compositions for chorus and wind instruments by Johannes Brahms, Charles Simon Catel, Franz Schubert and Robert Schumann. It will include works by Dittersdorf, Bach, Ives, Tchaikovsky and Liszt.

The ensemble is conducted by Dr. David Whitwell, with Roger Letson as assistant conductor.

The program is open to the public without charge, Dean Bolen said.
