Dr. Thomas Payne, professor of political science at the University of Montana, will discuss "Government and the Economy" at a free public lecture Wednesday, Feb. 25, at 7:30 p.m. in room 215 of the UM Women's Center.

The lecture is the fourth in a series of 10 sponsored under a \$900 grant from the Montana Committee for the Humanities (MCH), an organization headquartered at UM. The programs are part of the American Issues Forum Bicentennial Lecture Series.

Wednesday's program and the other lectures in the series, scheduled on alternate Wednesdays, are in conjunction with the American Issues Forum II Course by Newspaper, a series of essays offered during winter and spring quarters as an extension course by the UM Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs (CCESP). The essays are being published Sundays in the Missoulian.

The Wednesday lecture series is optional for students enrolled in the course by newspaper because two tests given in conjunction with the newspaper course will not include the lecture material. The tests will be March 17 and May 26 at the University. Cost of enrolling in the course by newspaper is \$26.

Coordinators of the course by newspaper and the lecture series are Dr. Leo B. Lott, professor of political science at UM, and Kim Williams, an instructor for the CCESP.
