DISCUSSION ABOUT EFFECTS OF SB1
SET THURSDAY AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA--

A panel discussion concerning the effects of the passage of Senate Bill 1 will be held at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 11, in the University Center (UC) Lounge at the University of Montana. The discussion is open to the public without charge.

Panelists will include Larry Cooper, KGVO-TV news director; Jonathan Krim, 1976-77 editor of the Montana Kaimin, the UM student newspaper, and Anne MacIntyre, a local member of the American Civil Liberties Union. Panel moderator will be Richard Kaudy, Kaimin managing editor.

Thursday's discussion, which is sponsored by UC Programming Services, will focus on how the passage of SB1 will affect media publication concerning criminal cases and national security issues, and to what extent SB1 would bring about pre-broadcast/censorship and pre-publication.

The UC Programming Services office encourages all interested persons to attend Thursday's discussion and participate in the program.
