October 8, 1940

The meeting was called to order by President Rae Greene. Minutes for the meeting of October 1 were read and approved.

Kennard reported on her meeting with Don Foss of Homecoming Committee who said it made no difference to them who put on the dance. Foss wants Kenneth Duff to take charge of Homecoming this year and suggested we meet with them to settle anything which might arise. Bill Carroll has already been asked to start working on his committee.

Greene remarked that in the past, the organization sponsoring this dance has made money and that A.S.M.S.U. will probably need about \$150 to balance the budget.

Haviland, from the Manager's Club, mentioned the amount of work this dance entails including picking a queen. Braizleton was also present and mentioned that this was about the only way Managers had of making money. They dislike losing the dance as it seems they started the tradition on this campus.

Garvin Shallenberger was present to represent the Bear Paws, and stated they wanted to put on the dance in order to raise money for the Bear Paw Convention to be held here this spring. He suggested Central Board put up the money for the Homecoming Dance, Bear Paws do the work, and divide the profits equally.

There is a possibility that Homecoming Committee will be satisfied with a \$100 guarantee.

Many plans were brought up for discussion. Badgley suggested splitting the net proceeds three ways.

After much discussion Lueck moved that Homecoming Dance be handled by A.S.M.S.U., Manager's Club and Bear Paws, with A.S.M.S.U. solely responsible for expenses and the net proceeds equally divided three ways. Ryan seconded it and the motion carried.

The annual problem of getting the band to Butte was brought up. They need \$138 over the \$126 allotted to them in the budget as Bell wants to take one hundred ten pieces. Greene asked the Budget and Finance Committee to look into this before our next meeting.
