JUDGE JAMESON TO ADDRESS
UM LAW STUDENTS FRIDAY

Judge William J. Jameson, Billings, senior district judge of the U.S. District Court, will be the first of four guest lecturers at the University of Montana Law School Friday, March 19.

Robert E. Sullivan, dean of the UM Law School, said Jameson's lecture is being sponsored under a \$2,500 grant from the Joseph N. Blankenbaker Foundation, Great Falls.

"The primary objective of the guest lecture series is to increase the sensitivity of law students in the areas of ethics and professional responsibility," Sullivan said.

Jameson, a UM alumnus who is originally from Butte, received his LL.B. degree from the University of Montana in 1922. He was a member of the Montana House of Representatives from 1927-31. He served as president of the Montana Bar Association in 1936-37. He was president of the American Bar Association from 1953-54, the second westerner to head that organization.

In 1952, Jameson received an honorary doctor of laws degree from UM. In 1957, after a nomination by President Eisenhower, Jameson took his seat as United States district judge for Montana.

Sullivan said other speakers to address UM law students this spring will include the Hon. Edward Allen Tamm, Chief Judge of the Emergency Court of Appeals of the U.S., Washington, D.C.; Eugene C. Thomas, attorney, Boise, Idaho, and John McNulty, attorney, Minneapolis, Minn.
