Meetings with several groups of University of Montana students Tuesday and Wednesday, March 30-31, are among those scheduled with former Watergate Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox while he is on the Missoula campus to present the seventh program in the Mansfield Lectures on International Relations.

Besides a free public lecture Wednesday night, Cox, who is Samuel Williston Professor of Law at Harvard University, will meet with University students in the social sciences at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday in room 11 of the UM Liberal Arts Building and with UM journalism students at 9 a.m. Wednesday in the UM Journalism Building Library.

Both class meetings also are open to UM faculty and staff members and the general public.

Cox will present the free public lecture honoring Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield at 8 p.m. Wednesday, March 31, in the University Theater. At the Wednesday night program, Cox will discuss "Can the Dream Survive?"

A public luncheon honoring Cox will be at noon Wednesday in the Montana Rooms on the third floor of the University Center. Luncheon tickets for University students will continue to be sold at the reduced rate of \$1.50 until Tuesday evening at the University Center Information Desk. Luncheon tickets are \$2.50 for UM faculty and staff members and the general public.

The Mansfield lecture program was established at UM in 1967 under the Mike and Maureen Mansfield Endowment of the UM Foundation in recognition of Senate Majority Leader Mansfield's quarter century of congressional service and the University's 75th anniversary in 1968.
