28 NIGHT COURSES OFFERED AT UM
WINTER QUARTER '76 BY CCESP

MISSOULA--

A total of 28 night courses are being offered during the 1976 winter quarter at the University of Montana in Missoula by the UM Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs (CCESP). A special course in education involving library-related topics also is scheduled three Saturdays in May at the University by the CCESP.

Residents of Missoula and vicinity interested in enrolling in one or more of the night courses may register at the first meeting of the respective courses. Most extension courses at the University are offered from 7-10 p.m. one night a week. Courses begin the week of April 5 and end the week of June 7.

Graduate or undergraduate credit is offered in 14 of the courses, while undergraduate credit only is available in 15 of the courses.

Fees are \$21 per credit hour or \$10.50 per credit hour for nonparticipating class auditors.
