WORLD HUNGER DISCUSSION IS MONDAY AT UM

MISSOULA--

Dr. Ronald F. Perrin, associate professor of philosophy at the University of Montana, will discuss "Economic and Political Dimensions of World Hunger" Monday at UM.

Perrin's discussion, which is open to the public without charge, will be at 7:30 p.m. Monday in room 215 of the University Women's Center. The talk is second in a series being conducted during spring quarter at UM on the theme, "Hunger in the World: Sources and Alternative Responses."

Besides being offered as a free series, the lectures also may be taken during spring quarter for one academic credit on a pass or no-pass basis under the UM course listing, Environmental Studies (EVST) 392. Credit is offered through the EVST Graduate Program.

In Monday's lecture, Perrin will develop the theme that the problem of world hunger is rooted in the struggle between contesting political ideologies and on an inequitable distribution of economic resources. He also will explore political and economic measures that he feels would help resolve the hunger crisis.
