EVENING OF CHAMBER MUSIC SET TUESDAY AT UM

MISSOULA--

Works by Bach, Stravinsky and Schubert will be included in an evening of chamber music Tuesday, April 13, at the University of Montana.

Tuesday's recital, which is open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. in the UM Music Recital Hall.

University music faculty participating in the program will include the following assistant professors--Bernard McWilliams, viola; Mary Jean Simpson, flute; George Riordan, oboe; John Ellis, harpsichord, and Constance Speake, piano.

Other UM faculty in the recital will include Dr. Edwin Rosenkranz, associate professor, bassoon; William Manning, associate professor, clarinet, and Priscilla Chadduck, instructor, soprano. Elizabeth McWilliams, a local soprano, also will participate in the recital.

Works on Tuesday's program include the prelude from "Suite No. 6 in G major" by J. S. Bach; "Trio Sonata in d minor, op. 2, No. 4" by Jean Baptiste Loeillet; "Trio Sonata in e minor" by Telemann; "Three Songs from William Shakespeare" by Stravinsky, and "Impromptu in B-flat major, op. 142, No. 3" and "Der Hirt auf dem Felsen" by Schubert.
