3 UM PROFESSORS TO HOLD WORKSHOPS AT 'WOMEN AWARE' CONFERENCE IN BOZEMAN

MISSOULA --

Three members of the University of Montana faculty will hold workshops at a conference entitled "Women Aware" this week in Bozeman.

Conference participants from UM--Judy Smith coordinator of the UM Women's Resource Center and assistant professor of social work; Mary Cummings, associate professor of social work, and Carolyn Wheeler, instructor in humanities--will conduct workshops on issues relating to women.

Several UM teaching assistants will also teach workshops at the conference, which will be held Thursday through Saturday, April 29-May 1, in the Montana State University Student Union Building.

Betty Friedan, author of "The Feminine Mystique"; Dr. Warren Farrell, author of "The Liberated Man," and Dr. Jennifer James, professor of psychology and psychiatry at the University of Washington, will be keynote speakers at the conference.

The conference is directed by "Focus on Women," a Bozeman women's program, and is sponsored by 14 Montana women's organizations, including the UM Women's Resource Center.
