MISSOULA--

Kenneth F. Clawson, Missoula, marketing representative of the Missoula Division of the Montana Power Co., will present a filmstrip-lecture program entitled "The Colstrip Story" Friday, May 7, at the University of Montana in Missoula.

The presentation, which will be open to the public without charge, will be at noon Friday in room 307 of the UM Natural Science Building. Friday's program is one in a series of spring quarter lectures at UM dealing with current environmental problems.

Following introductory remarks by Clawson, a 25-minute filmstrip dealing with Colstrip Units 3 and 4, the coal-fired electrical generating plants planned for eastern Montana, will be shown Friday. A question and answer session involving the audience will follow the filmstrip.

Clawson, a 1959 graduate of Drummond High School, received a bachelor of science/degree in industrial arts at Montana State University, Bozeman, and a bachelor of science degree in business administration at UM. He was employed by the Boeing Co., Seattle, Wash., from 1966-71, and has been with the Montana Power Co. since 1971.

Friday's program is sponsored by the UM Department of Botany. Dr. Meyer Chessin, UM botany professor, is coordinator of the lecture series.
