Schacco (pronounced shocko) von Estorff, Seattle, Wash., consul general at the Consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany, who will speak Saturday, May 8, at the University of Montana during the 22nd annual conference of the Montana Association of Language Teachers (MALT), will be available Saturday morning at UM for informal discussions with local high school teachers and others who may be interested.

Dr. O. W. Rolfe, associate professor of foreign languages at UM, who is MALT president, said Von Estorff will discuss "Two Hundred Years of German-American Relations" at a MALT conference session at approximately 2:30 p.m. Saturday in room 336 of the UM Liberal Arts Building. Von Estorff's talk, which will be in German, will be open to all interested persons.

The conference begins Friday and continues through Saturday at UM.
