UM PROF PLANS HELENA LECTURE

Dr. Firman H. Brown, Jr., chairman of the University of Montana drama department will present a lecture on Eugene O'Neill's "Long Day's Journey Into Night," Thursday evening at Carroll College in Helena.

The speech is a prelude to the play which will be presented at the College later this month.

Dr. Brown received his BA and MA degrees from the University of Montana and his PhD degree from the University of Wisconsin.

He has also served as director of radio-television for the State Historical Society of Wisconsin.

Dr. Brown taught drama and English and was director of Public Service for Northern Montana College.

He writes a weekly column, "On Stage with Bo Brown," for the Missoulian.

Founder and director of the Bigfork Summer Playhouse, he is also secretary-treasurer of the Montana Arts Council.

In 1963, Dr. Brown took the University production of "The Fantastiks" on an Asian tour.

Brown is a member of the National Theatre Conference. Membership is limited to 100 outstanding directors of collegiate and community theaters in the United States, Canada and Mexico.

He is also a member of the American Educational Theater Assn., the American National Theater and Academy, the American Society for Theater Research and the Montana Institute of the Arts.
