ART PROF. JOHN MASON TO SPEAK JUNE 30
IN UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA RECITAL HALL

MISSOULA--

John Mason, a professor of art on leave from the University of California, Irvine, who has been teaching at Hunter College, New York, N.Y., will give a free public lecture at 8 p.m. Wednesday, June 30, in the Music Recital Hall at the University of Montana.

The title of the lecture is to be announced.

The lecture will be sponsored by the Montana Arts Council, an agency of the state government.

Mason is scheduled to teach a one-week workshop in ceramic-sculpture from June 28 to July 2 at UM. The workshop is offered for two academic credits. Interested persons may contact the UM art department for further information by phoning 243-4181.

Mason, a native of Madrid, Neb., studied at the Otis Art Institute and Chouinard Art Institute in Los Angeles. He has received a number of prizes for his works, many of which have been displayed in various galleries.
