LAST BICENTENNIAL CONCERT  
SCHEDULED WEDNESDAY AT UM

MISSOULA--

The Montana Chamber Orchestra and Chorus will complete 10 days of residence in the School of Fine Arts at the University of Montana in Missoula with a free public concert Wednesday, June 30, at 8 p.m. in the University Theater.

The last of three bicentennial concerts under the baton of Lawrence Smith, music director of the Oregon Symphony Orchestra, will consist of Prokofieff's "Classical Symphony"; Mozart's Serenade, K. 250 ("Haffner"), and Bach's "Cantata #140."

The 10-day session, devoted to rehearsal and performance, is supported in part by the Montana Arts Council, an agency of state government. Members of the orchestra and chorus were selected by audition and may receive academic credit for participation.

Kelly Farris, concertmaster of the Spokane Symphony Orchestra, Spokane, Wash., is concertmaster of the orchestra. Susan Vaughan, White Bear Lake, Minn., is piano accompanist for the chorus.
