MISSOULA--

The Housing Office at the University of Montana in Missoula has released the names of 75 UM students who have been appointed to serve as office staff members in UM residence halls during the 1976-77 academic year.

Thomas H. Hayes, UM director of housing, said students who have been appointed head residents, assistant head residents and resident assistants in the campus dormitories will participate in the "Residence Halls Staff Orientation" program Sept. 11-17 at Camp Paxon, Seeley Lake, 55 miles northeast of Missoula.

Part I of the orientation for members of the upper staff, including dormitory head residents and assistant head residents, will be from Sept. 11 through the morning of Sept. 13.
