## UM - ENGLISH DEBATERS TO MEET WEDNESDAY

A University of Montana debate team will meet an English team tomorrow night, March 23. The debate will be held at 8 p.m. in the Um Music Recital Hall. There will be no admission charge.

Representing the University of Montana will be Donna Pentz, Poplar, and Walter Kirkpatrick, Billings. The English debaters are R. Marshall Andrews from Birmingham University and I. Geoffrey Bing from Bristol University.

The proposition will be "Resolved: That American Policy in Viet Nam Should Be Deplored."

Dr. Ralph Y. McInnis, UM director of forensics and debate coach, will moderate the debate. Since the debate is for demonstration purposes only, there will be no judge present.

The debate will last 1 hour after which questions from the audience will be answered.

Dr. McInnis commented that the UM debaters have a better than 75% record this year.
