FACULTY RECITAL IS SUNDAY AT UM

Dr. Florence Reynolds, professor of music at the University of Montana in Missoula, and Rudolph Wendt, professor emeritus of music at UM, will be featured on the violoncello and piano, respectively, during a faculty recital Sunday, Oct. 3, at UM.

The recital, open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. Sunday in the UM Music Recital Hall.

Sunday's program will be varied and will include a work entitled "Sonata" by Herbert Inch, a Missoula native. The work was played by Reynolds and Wendt when they participated in the Bicentennial Parade of American Music at Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., on Montana Day Aug. 31.

Inch, who lives in Los Angeles, Calif., attended UM and the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N.Y. He taught at the Eastman School of Music and at Hunter College, New York City.

Other works included on Sunday's program are "Sonata in E Major" by G. Valentini, "Sonata in C Major" by Haydn, "Passacaglia" by Isadore Freed, "Requiebros" by Cassado, "Piece en Forme de Habanera" by Ravel-Bazelaire, and "Figaro" from "The Barber of Seville," a concert transcription by Rossini-Castelnuovo Tedesco.

Sunday's program is the first in a series of music recitals to be presented through the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music during the 1976-77 academic year.

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
