Dr. John C. Ellis, assistant professor of organ and music theory at the University of Montana, will present an organ recital Tuesday, Oct. 5, at the University of Montana.

The recital, open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. Tuesday in the UM Music Recital Hall.

Tuesday's presentation is listed as "A Program of Music in the Germanic Tradition." Ellis also is University organist.

Works to be included in the recital are: "Prelude and Fugue in E-Minor" in Nikolaus Bruhns; "Chorale Preludes" by J. S. Bach; "Chorale Preludes" by Johannes Brahms; "Works for Flute Clock" by Joseph Haydn; "Chorale Preludes" by Gerhard Krapf, Ernst Pepping and Herman Schroeder; "Chorale Preludes" by Max Reger; "Sketch in D-Flat Major" by Robert Schumann, and "Prelude and Fugue on B A C H" by Franz Liszt.
