## LETSON PLAYS UM RECITAL TUESDAY

Roger L. Letson, a graduate assistant in the University of Montana Music Department, will present a trumpet recital Tuesday, March 29, at 8:15 p.m. in the Recital Hall, according to Dean Charles W. Bolen of the School of Fine Arts.

The recitalist will be assisted at the piano by Vernon Overmyer, instructor in music, and Lynn Hough, sophomore music major from Kevin.

The program, which is open to the public without charge, is comprised of Sonata by Kent Kennan, Rhapsodie by Robert Darcy, Concert Piece by William Mayer, Capriccioso by Paul Jean Jean and Rondo for Lify by Leonard Bernstein.

After earning a bachelor of music degree at the University in 1963, Letson taught for two years at Park County High School, Livingston. He returned to the campus in the fall of 1965 to work for a master of music degree in applied trumpet. The recital Tuesday is one of the requirements for the degree, which will be conferred in June upon completion of his graduate work.

While working for the master's degree, Letson is serving as a graduate of the University. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. William Letson of Conrad.
