AUTHOR CAROLINE BIRD TO SPEAK AT UNIVERSITY WEDNESDAY, OCT. 27

MISSOULA --

Author and lecturer Caroline Bird, <u>Poughkeepsie</u>, <u>N.Y.</u>, will present a lecture entitled "Enterprising Women" at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 27, in the University Center (UC) Ballroom at the University of Montana.

The free public lecture is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students of UM. A public reception in the UC Montana Rooms will be held for Bird Oct. 27, following the lecture.

"Enterprising Women" is also the title of Bird's latest book, which is a series of profiles on businesswomen in America. Other books she has written include "Born Female: The High Cost of Keeping Women Down"; "The Case Against College"; "Everything a Woman Needs to Know to Get Paid What She's Worth", and several other books dealing with the status of women in America.

Bird has been a member of the editorial staffs of "The New York Journal of Commerce,"
"Fortune" and "Newsweek" magazines. From 1972-73 she was the Froman Distinguished
Professor at Russell Sage College in Troy, N.Y.

Bird, who studied at Vassar College, <u>Poughkeepsie</u>, received the bachelor of arts degree in American history from the University of Toledo, <u>Toledo</u>, <u>Ohio</u>, and the master of arts degree in comparative literature from the University of Wisconsin, <u>Madison</u>. She is a native of New York, N.Y.
