MISSOULA--

Mezzo-soprano Esther England and pianist Dennis Alexander will be featured in a faculty recital entitled "An Evening of Brahms" Sunday, Nov. 7, at the University of Montana in Missoula.

The program, which is open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. Sunday in the UM Music Recital Hall.

During Sunday's program, England and Alexander will be assisted by pianist John Ellis, an assistant professor of music at UM, and members of the Missoula Mendelssohn Club and men from the University Choir.

Donald Carey, associate professor of music at UM, will conduct the Mendelssohn Club and singers from the University Choir.

Works on Sunday's program include "Variations on an Original Theme, Opus 21, No. 1"; "Walzer, op. 39," and "Alto Rhapsodie, op. 53." The latter work is from the "Harzriese in Winter" by Goethe.

The Missoula Mendelssohn Club, a chorus which is now in its 32nd season in the Garden City, is composed of men from various walks of life.

Stage managing of the evening recitals at the University is a service project of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, men's music honorary.
