MISSOULA--

A concert by the "Montagnana Trio," a group which includes a visiting violinist from Australia, will be presented Tuesday, Nov. 16, at the University of Montana as part of the University's 1976 Fall Concert Series.

The program, open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. Tuesday in the University Music Recital Hall.

Trio members include violinist Christopher Kimber, who is from Australia, and two members of the UM faculty, Dr. Florence Reynolds, professor, who plays the Violoncello, and Dennis Alexander, assistant professor, pianist.

Works on Tuesday's program include "Trio in G Major, K. 564" by Mozart; "Trio in E-Flat Major, Op. 1, No. 1" by Beethoven, and "Trio in C major, op. 87" by Brahms.

Kimber will be in Montana for about a month to conduct workshops and concerts in various communities. He will be guest artist for the Missoula Civic Symphony concert at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 14, in the University Theater at UM.

In 1972, Kimber became head of the string department at Ohio State University. He has taught at Oberlin Conservatory and is now on the faculty of New South Wales Conservatorium of Music, Sydney, Australia. He was a guest artist at UM during the summers of 1974 and 1975 and was concert-master of the Montana Chamber Orchestra.

Dr. Reynolds, director of the student Young Artists String Quartets, is principal violoncellist with the Missoula Symphony and violoncellist with the Montana String Quartet, groups in residence in the UM School of Fine Arts.

She is well known throughout the Northwest as a string clinician and adjudicator, and a participant in dialogue concerts for school children.

Since joining the piano faculty at UII in 1972, Alexander has been an accompanist, chamber music performer and solo artist. He appeared as a guest soloist with the Missoula Symphony in 1974, playing Schumann's Concerto in A minor. He has been active throughout the state in adjudicating, concertizing, and doing workshops and master classes.

Alexander is a member of Phi Mu Alpha professional fraternity and Pi Kappa Lambda music honor society. He performed duo-recitals at UM with Kimber during the summers of 1974 and 1975.
