WILLIAM PATTON NAMED NATEBOE LUNCHEON CHAIRMAN

MISSOULA--

Dr. William E. Patton, assistant professor of education at the University of Montana, who is treasurer of the National Association of Business Teacher Educators of Business and Office Education (NATEBOE), has been selected to chair the Dec. 6 NATEBOE luncheon in Houston, Tex., in conjunction with the American Vocational / Association (AVA) annual convention. The convention runs from Dec. 3-8.

Patton has served as treasurer of NATEBOE for the past year and a half and his term of office will expire June 30, 1977.

Also participating in the meetings of the AVA convention will be Dr. Donald Koeppen, chairman of the Division of Business Education and Office Administration at UM. Koeppen will represent NATEBOE as a member of the Business and Office Division Policy and Planning Committee of AVA.

Koeppen, who formerly served as NATEBOE president, was elected to the committee last December when the American Vocational Association met in Anaheim, Calif., and his term will expire June 30, 1979.
