ANDY RUSSELL TO LECTURE ON WILDLIFE AT UNIVERSITY TUESDAY, NOV. 23

MISSOULA --

Andy Russell, wildlife author and photographer, will present a lecture-film entitled "Grizzly Country" at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 23, in the Men's Gym at the University of Montana.

The lecture is open to the public free of charge. The UM Wildlife Society and the Associated Students of UM Program Council will cosponsor the event.

Russell, a native of <u>Lethbridge</u>, <u>Alta.</u>, <u>Can.</u>, has been involved with wildlife as a trapper, hunter, professional guide and naturalist. He has written four books including "Grizzly Country," "Trails of a Wilderness Wanderer," "Horns in the High Country" and "The High West."

"Grizzly Country," which is a full-length movie, describes the relationship between grizzly bear and man, and focuses on man and bear as they share an environment in an atmosphere of mutual respect. Wildlife of the northwest regions of the North American Continent are included in the film.
