MISSOULA --

A "Guest Artist Recital" will be presented Monday, Nov. 29, at the University of Montana by Australian violinist Christopher Kimber and pianist Dennis Alexander, an assistant professor of music at UM.

The free public recital, sponsored by the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be at 8 p.m. Monday in the University Music Recital Hall.

Kimber and Alexander, along with Dr. Florence Reynolds, a UM music professor, are members of the "Montagnana Trio," a group which has been performing in Missoula and other communities. Reynolds plays the violoncello in the trio.

Works to be presented by Kimber and Alexander on Monday's program include "Sonata in e minor, BWV 1023" by Bach; "Sonata in A Major, Opus 100" by Brahms; "Sonata in g minor" by Debussy; "Sonata No. 3 for solo violin" by Ysaye, and "Concerto in d minor, Opus 22" by Wieniawski.

Kimber has been in Montana about a month to conduct workshops and concerts in various communities. He was guest artist for a Missoula Civic Symphony concert recently. In 1972, Kimber became head of the string department at Ohio State University. He has taught at Oberlin Conservatory and is now on the faculty of New South Wales Conservatorium of Music, Sydney, Australia. He was a guest artist at UM during the summers of 1974 and 1975 and was concertmaster of the Montana Chamber Orchestra.

Since joining the UM music faculty at UM in 1972, Alexander has been an accompanist, chamber music performer and solo artist. He appeared as a guest soloist with the Missoula Symphony in 1974, playing Schumann's "Concerto in A minor." He performed in duo-recitals with Kimber in the summers of 1974 and 1975.
