JAZZ PERFORMANCE SET JAN. 7 AT UNIVERSITY

Barry Martyn and the Legends of Jazz, a six-member New Orleans jazz combo, will perform Jan. 7 at the University of Montana in Missoula.

The presentation by the jazz group will be at 8 p.m. Jan. 7 in the University Center Ballroom.

Offering an authentic repertoire in the jazz tradition, members of the Legends of Jazz, with the exception of drummer and leader Barry Martyn, are original New Orleans jazz musicians. Bassman Edward "Montudi" Garland is America's oldest performing jazz musician.

Tickets--\$1.50 for students and \$3 for the general public--to the Jan. 7 performance will go on sale Dec. 27 at the Associated Student's Store on the mall level of the University Center; Eli's Records and Tapes, 3629 Brooks, and the Missoula Mercantile, Higgins Avenue and Front Street.
