September 28, 1937

The meeting was called to order by President Peter Murphy, who presided. The minutes of the meeting of May 25 were read and approved.

Since Central Board intended to re-appoint the same faculty members who served on the standing committees during the year 1936-37, Singleton moved that Mr. Merriam replace Mr. Atkinson on the Outside Entertainment Committee for the year 1937-38. Chambers seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Badgley reported that nothing was done during the summer to repair or improve the tennis courts, principally because the payment of part of Mr. Mel Rawn's salary for the months of May and June substantially reduced the unbudgeted reserve. Since much of Mr. Rawn's work during May and June was with student organization accounts, the amount of \$166.67 was not approved as a state obligation and was, therefore, paid from ASMSU funds. Shaw moved that Central Board ratify the payment of \$5.00 from the Debate and Oratory Fund for a debate trip to Spokane during the past summer and Rawn's salary payment for part of May and June of \$166.67 taken from the general unbudgeted reserve fund. Chambers seconded. Motion carried.

Seymour presented a plan for the purchase of a cub bear whereby Central Board would pay \$10.00, the Athletic Board, \$10.00, and the Traditions Committee, the balance of \$15.00. He also suggested that the cub be sold next spring and the money kept in a kind of revolving fund for the purchase of a new cub each fall to be disposed of each spring. Chambers moved that Central Board appropriate \$10.00 from the unbudgeted reserve to apply on the purchase of the cub bear, with the understanding that Seymour would take care of the bear. Singleton seconded. Motion carried.

Grace Johnson presented a request from Dean DeLoss Smith that the glee clubs be given preference by Central Board in the appropriation of money for state publicity trips. Shaw moved that Central Board give the glee clubs preference over other school organizations in the appropriation of funds for publicity trips this year. Singleton seconded. Motion carried.

Action on a letter from Grace Johnson regarding Central Board's sponsoring a matinee mixer was deferred until the following meeting.
