November 9, 1937

The meeting was called to order by President Peter Murphy, who presided. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected.

Chambers reported that information as to the amount of the royalty for "Hit the Deck" has not yet been received.

Woodgerd reported that she and Paulson would meet with Mabelle Gould from Mortar Board, Jean Fritz from Traditions Board, a delegate from Silent Sentinel, and with DeLoss Smith on November 10 to consider different songs for the students to vote on to select an official school song.

Murphy reported that the committee on incorporation of the student body met the previous Sunday and also that a publicity story regarding the proposed incorporation had been released to the Kaimin.

Wayne Laine presented the problem of the Kaimin Editor's salary. This salary was expected to be \$25 a month for nine months, \$15 a month being provided for in the Kaimin budget, and a scholarship was expected to provide \$10 a month. This scholarship is derived from the income on the investment of an \$1800 fund. However, since this fund has not been earning the expected \$90 during the past year, the Kaimin Editor is at present receiving only \$15 a month. Carmody moved that the President appoint a committee to investigate the Kaimin situation and to report at the next meeting. Chambers seconded. Chambers, Singleton, Pantzer, Laine, and Badgley were appointed on this committee.
