November 23, 1937

The meeting was called to order by President Peter Murphy, who presided. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

After Brown reported Athletic Board's favorable action on the matter of free admission to athletic events for three years following completion of varsity competition for "M" men, Chambers moved that Central Board approve the idea that "M" men be given, upon application and identification, tickets to major athletic contests for three years following completion of varsity competition and after that preference, when possible, in seating arrangements for major athletic contests, providing M Club shall work out a plan acceptable to Central Board for carrying out this program so that it will be set up on a permanent basis. Hanrahan seconded. Motion carried.

Giltner asked for an appropriation by Central Board for purpose of running pictures of students in different papers for publicity. Suggested that Chambers go over the budget to see if there is any money which could be used for this purpose.

Larson said that the horseshoe table which was purchased with Kaimin funds several years ago is no longer of use to Journalism students, and he asked if it could be given to Missoula County High School. It was decided that an attempt should first be made to sell it.
