November 30, 1937

The meeting was called to order by President Peter Murphy, who presided. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected.

After discussion of a request from Mr. Harrington, Singleton moved that Central Board does not authorize the expenditure of Masquers funds to defray Mr. Harrington's expenses to attend the Northwest Theatre Conference in Seattle February 17, 18 and 19, 1938. Paulson seconded. Motion carried.

Briggs moved that the ASMSU Secretary be authorized to request a statement from DeLoss Smith or from the Business Manager of the Glee Clubs, if there is one, regarding the plans for a trip by the Glee Clubs. Hanrahan seconded. Motion carried.

Chambers said that he had been unable to study the budget to determine the possibility of appropriating funds for Giltner's use in student publicity, but that he would have a report for the next meeting.

Shaw called attention to the fact that Jack Rose and Wayne Gitchel were entitled to Minor Sports letters because of their competing in and winning first and second places in the Pacific Coast Cross Country Run at Portland. This will be acted upon by Minor Sports Board.

Larson said that there is a possibility that the University can use the horseshoe table, and he will consult President Simmons regarding the administration's buying it. The original cost of this table was reported as \$193.35.
