October 27, 1936

The meeting was called to order by Ray Whitcomb, President of A.S.U.M. It was the first joint meeting of the year of Central Board and Store Board.

Bud Whittinghill gave a report on the funds allotted for the improvement of the tennis courts and what work had been done on the project. He reported that \$200 had been spent on new backstops (approximately) and \$80 for new nets. The motion was made: That the money not used in the construction of backstops and the purchase of new nets be returned to the general fund. The motion was carried.

Jack Hughes gave a report on the last meeting of Traditions Committee and their plans for the future.

Plans for the send-off of the team to Corvallis, Oregon were discussed. The team will leave Thursday at 3:05.

A favorable report on the progress of the committee working on the revision of the student constitution was given by Ray Whitcomb.

The plan of the Bearpaws to bring back green caps for Freshmen was discussed. Warden made the motion: That if the Bearpaws can present some workable plan for the enforcement of freshman caps to Central Board, that the plan will be discussed. The motion was carried.

It was decided to hold freshman elections on Thursday, November 5, at 4:30 in the afternoon. All members of Central Board are to be present.

The tri-weekly edition of the Kaimin was discussed. Publications Board will meet soon and submit a report to Central Board for consideration.

Store Board reported on its investigation of the fountain service in the Students' store. Central Board made the recommendation that Store Board conduct a public relations campaign to promote better understanding between the students and the store.

There was a motion for adjournment.
