UW HISTORY PROFESSOR TO SPEAK
ON UNIVERSITY CAMPUS APRIL 28

Dr. Giovanni Costigan, professor of history at the University of Washington, will make two appearances on the University of Montana campus April 28.

At a 3 p.m. speech in the Lodge he will discuss "The War in Viet Nam." That evening, he will make an 8 p.m. speech in the journalism theatre entitled "Freud and History."

Dr. Costigan specializes in the fields of English and modern European history. In addition to two books and numerous articles for professional journals, he has taught a television course on the history of England. His most recent book, "Sigmund Freud, a short biography," was published in 1965.

He was born in Kingston-on-Thames, England in 1905. He received his bachelor's degree from Oxford University, one master's degree from Oxford, and another master's degree and a PhD degree from the University of Wisconsin.

Before joining the University of Washington faculty in 1934, he was an assistant in history at Wisconsin and an assistant and associate professor of history and English at the University of Idaho.

He has made many trips to Europe since making his home in the United States. He visited the Middle East and Israel in 1951 and 1957, South Africa and India in 1956, Russia in 1959 and the Far East and Japan in 1960.

Professor Costigan served in the United States Air Force during World War II.

He was honored as "Man of the Year" in March, 1958, by the Seattle Lodge of the B'nai B'rith for "his work in the field of brotherhood and his great contributions to better human relations."
