DUO SONATA RECITAL
SLATED AT UNIVERSITY

Marie Runberg, violinist, and Vernon Overmyer, pianist, will present a duo sonata recital Tuesday (April 26) at 8:15 p.m. in the University of Montana Recital Hall, according to Dean Charles W. Bolen of the School of Fine Arts.

The program, which is open to the public without charge, consists of Sonata in B-flat, K. 454 by Mozart; Sonata in G, Op. 30, No. 3, by Beethoven and Sonata in E-flat, Op. 18, by Richard Strauss.

Miss Runberg is director of the orchestra program in the Missoula grade schools and concertmaster of the Missoula Symphony Orchestra. She has presented many recitals, including one at Carnegie Hall in New York City, and has played concerti with orchestras in the West and Midwest. A recipient of Presser Foundation and National Federation of Music Club awards, she holds a master of music degree from Indiana University.

Overmyer was a lecturer in piano at the University of Southern California before joining the UM music faculty in the fall of 1965. He has given recitals in California and Montana and has toured with the Roger Wagner Chorale. He earned a master's degree from California State College, Long Beach.

Miss Runberg and Overmyer will be soloists in a concert in the 1966-67 Missoula Symphony series.
