## UM PROFESSOR PREPARES SCIENCE EXPERIMENT KIT

James W. Cox, University of Montana assistant professor of chemistry and education, announced today the publication and production of 30,000 experimental kits dealing with "The Reactivity of Metals."

The kits are distributed to high school students and teachers under the auspices of the Science Service, a division of the Friends of Science. The Washington D. C. company, organized on a non-profit basis, receives experimental works from science professors and industrial experts throughout the nation and prepares them for distribution.

The kit which Cox prepared contains six separate experiments dealing with how metal reacts under different conditions.

Cox said that Science Service has been operating for over eight years and has gained wide respect among science teachers in the secondary school systems of the nation.
