October 30, 1934

The meeting was called to order by the president, Kenneth Duff.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that if any member of Central Board, including Faculty members, is absent from a meeting, that member shall treat the entire group to candy bars at the meeting following his absence.

Dick Shaw gave a report about the new entertainment and the expenses involved.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that a committee, composed of P.J. Malone, Betty Anne Polleys, Dick Shaw, and Kirk Badgley, act for Central Board in choosing the most satisfactory financial basis for the new entertainment. This committee will have the authority to make any necessary agreements which will meet with the approval of Mr. Taylor and the committee as a whole.

A discussion was held concerning the price of admission tickets.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to the effect that the "house" (Wilma Theater) shall be divided into two parts: one half reserved for the students with seats selling for fifty-five cents, seventy-five cents, and one dollar sixty-five cents (loges) for the first four days or some such specified time, the other half, reserved for residents of Missoula, with seats selling for one dollar ten cents, seventy-five cents, and one dollar sixty-five cents (loges) during the first four days or the specified time. After this advanced ticket sale, as indicated in the motion as four days, the seats in all sections will sell for one dollar ten cents, seventy-five cents, and one dollar sixty-five cents, to both students and residents of Missoula.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that Leighton Downing be elected to the position of Assistant Manager of Minor Sports for the coming year.

The president, Kenneth Duff, suggested that all members of Central Board wear Varsity Caps throughout pep rallies and convocations held before the Idaho Game.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned.

October 30, 1934

The meeting was called to order by the president, Kenneth Duff.

Tavis Hoblitt advised the necessity of Central Board electing two members for the Publications Board.

A nominating committee of Roger Grattan and Jean Gordon were appointed to select names of students eligible for membership on the Publications Board. These names are to be submitted at the next meeting.

Dick Shaw gave a report on the new entertainment.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the new entertainment be put on at the Wilma Theater.

Mr. Taylor suggested that a price of one dollar thirty-five cents be made for logs during the new entertainment.

Dick Shaw and Kirk Badgley made the final decision concerning the financial basis for the new entertainment; the flat basis will be used.

The management of the "Desert Song" will have the authority in making the decision as to whether or not the dress rehearsal practice will be held at the High School auditorium.

It was suggested that another announcement be placed in the Kaimin concerning the prize awarded for the most suitable and appropriate name for the new entertainment.

Dick Shaw was given authority to select assistants for this production.

It was also suggested that a committee be appointed immediately for revising the "M" Book for the coming year.

Freshman elections will be held on Monday, November 5, at 4:00 p.m. in Main Hall.

The meeting was adjourned.
