POTENTIAL TEACHER INTERVIEWS
SLATED ON UM CAMPUS

Over 30 outstanding seniors from western Montana high schools will be interviewed on the University of Montana campus Saturday morning, May 14, as candidates for five scholarships in education, according to Charles E. Hood, chairman of the UM teaching scholarship committee.

The Montana Federated Women's Clubs, District II, is making one \$85 scholarship and two \$75 scholarships available to outstanding senior students who plan to prepare for elementary or high school teaching, and who plan to enroll at one of the units of the University of Montana for this preparation. The Women's Club scholarships are available to high school seniors in the following counties: Sanders, Lake, Mineral, Missoula, Ravalli, Granite, Powell, Deer Lodge, Silver Bow, Beaverhead and Madison.

Phi Delta Kappa, a professional Fraternity for men in education has as one of its goals encouraging capable young men to enter teaching. In an effort to do something specific about this goal, Gamma Zeta chapter at the University is providing one \$100 scholarship to a young man interested in teaching.

The Ravalli County local of the Montana Education Association, in cooperation with the Hamilton local, is awarding one \$100 scholarship to a senior from a Ravalli county high school.

Candidates are invited to the UM campus for testing and interview. They will be selected on the basis of: (1) high school achievement; (2) scholastic aptitude; (3) character and interest, and (4) evaluation of confidential recommendations.
