TANZANIAN DELEGATE TO UN PLANS FRIDAY SPEECH
ON "AFRICA 1966, THE PROSPECTS FOR PEACE."

The Counsellor to the Tanzanian Mission to the United Nations, Paul Eliel Mwaluko, will speak at the University of Montana this Friday (May 20).

The speech, entitled "Africa, 1966, The Prospects for Peace," is planned for 4 p.m. in the Music Recital Hall. It will be open to the public. A question and answer period will follow the lecture.

Mr. Mwaluko was born in 1935 in the central region of Tanzania. He holds a BA degree and also received a post-graduate degree from Oxford University.

He served as Principal Assistant Secretary to the Ministry of Finance before being assigned to the United Nations.

Mr. Mwaluko is single. His interests include sports, African classical and modern music, African poetry and dancing.
